Chief Tro told us that Canby has few serious auto accidents overall. Parking lots are in play in about half of incidents, also downtown. These are mostly slow speed accidents.

Canby Police will initiate the railroad safety campaign this fall centered mostly on pedestrian youth crossing railroad tracks or walking near the tracks. They will be distributing safety information. They plan to add officers at crossing areas to influence those who cross is unsafe areas.

Clackamas County PBCAC submitted a letter regarding bike lane on S Ivy Street abutting the north bound travel lane south of 13<sup>th</sup> Street. This committee agreed with letter and Mindy said she will email the letter to Jerry Nelzen and Joe Merek.

We discussed the need for crosswalks on N redwood St. Pedestrian traffic across Redwood has increased very significantly with the housing hat has been developed on the east side of Redwood. Many pedestrians are crossing seeking access to the Logging Road Trial.

This year's Bike Rodeo will be held June 8 at Knight Elementary School. This is a popular event that turns out 100 to 200 kids.
